"Now to God who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine...be glory...forever and ever. Amen." Ephesians 3:20-21

We follow an immeasurable, all powerful, everpresent, all-knowing God. We follow a God that promises to be with us, to listen to us, and to act on our behalf.

I was thinking about these verses in relation to our current world. I often hear about how churches *used to be* filled with young people; how Wednesdays *used to be* considered "holy days" for the church; how people *used to be* eager to have their kids baptized, or to send their kids to confirmation. There is, perhaps, a sense of disillusionment within the church.

But our God is moving, not stagnant. Our God is at work, not idle. And because of that...

I believe that we can continue to reach families and young people in our community.

Rooted in this faith in God, I proposed to our Council the idea to create a full-time Youth Director position at our church. I believe that investing in this position will give us the focus that our church needs to continue to reach our young people.

Back in the day (do I sound old?) I worked in full-time youth ministry. But it started as part-time. The church had to take a step of faith to make my position full-time. Full-time meant a sustainable salary, and the hours needed to focus on the ministry. Through that step of faith the church saw growth. First, they saw **numerical growth**, from 115 middle schoolers to our peak at 153, and from 4 high schoolers to 40 high schoolers in just 2 years.

Second, they saw **programmatic growth**. Annual summer trips, annual retreats happening twice a year, special events every month, and more. Their volunteer

base nearly quadrupled, and the programs expanded into family and adult ministry.

Thirdly, they saw **spiritual growth**. Students were leading the way in the church for Evangelism, inviting their friends (and their families) to church. Students were signing up for opportunities to learn more about Jesus. Students were starting to volunteer in more places throughout the church, outside of youth group. Students were starting to have faith conversations with their parents at home.

In a post-pandemic world, it can be hard to dream about our potential. It can be hard to see how God is at work in our church and in our world. But we believe in a God that is at work even when we can't see it.

This fall we're going to ask the congregation to take a step of faith. A step of faith in the church's budget, and in your own. We'll ask you to approve the proposal for a full-time youth position at the **special congregational meeting on Sunday, November 5th at 11:15am in person or on zoom**. We'll also ask you to help us to increase our budget through your giving to meet our goal.

There is a lot of info that I can't cover in this (already too long) newsletter article. More information will come with our fall stewardship drive. We will also have some temple talks at church on Sundays to give more information about the position - so please worship with us in person or online.

For now, please be praying for our church, our youth, and our youth ministry.



<sup>18</sup>I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth, <sup>19</sup>and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God. <sup>20</sup>Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, <sup>21</sup>to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen." Ephesians 3:18-21

A good friend of mine, Josh Christenson, is a pastor in the Baptist church. Years ago he planted a church called *Imagine Church*, and they use this Ephesians 3:20 as their mission statement.

Church planting is hard work. A pastor who plants a church finds themselves to be: fundraiser, CEO, CFO, HR, Program Director, spiritual leader, preacher...the list goes on. Some church plants boom with attendance, some close their doors, and some see consistent numbers, and maybe a little bit of growth.

For years *Imagine Church* was one with consistent numbers. Not an incredible boom, but not closing their doors either.

Is *Imagine Church* evidence of a place where God is doing "immeasurably more"?

Yes!

The measure of God's work is not the same as how we measure our work.

Our work is often measured by numbers. Numbers on a scale. Numbers on a chart. Numbers in our checkbook. Numbers on a test.

But God's work is measured in presence, relationships, faith, and joy.

And for you, in your unique situation - God is at work within you to accomplish abundantly more than you could ask or imagine. God's work may not look how you want it to look, but God's work is exactly what you need. To God be the glory. Amen.

### Youth & Family Ministry Report

We are resuming **Wednesday Confirmation classes** (grades 6-8) beginning October 11<sup>th</sup>. The youth and families are invited to participate in the Community Meal at 5:30 pm. Confirmation begins with the Contemporary Worship Service starting at 6:00 pm and they will be dismissed at 7:30 PM. Confirmation orientation is October 4th (5:30pm meal; 6-7pm meeting).

Our **9**<sup>th</sup> **grade Confirmation** students and parents will attend the Confirmation Orientation on October 4th (as above). Ninth graders, and students ready to be confirmed, will meet on Sunday Oct. 15 & 22, at 11:15-12:15. Confirmation rehearsal will be Oct. 27th from 6-7pm in the sanctuary. **Confirmation Service** will be Sunday October 29<sup>th</sup>, and students with families should arrive at church by 9:30am. Monday, October 30<sup>th</sup> will be the first full day as a new member of our church!

Sunday School will resume October 1<sup>st</sup>. Young children, age 3 years through 2<sup>nd</sup> grade, can be excused from church after the Children's message for a time of singing, Bible stories and crafts. They will come back down to the sanctuary for communion and a blessing. Speaking of Children's message, Pastor Calvin's talks have been fun! We do have Busy Bags available at the entrance to the sanctuary for those restless moments.

"Holy Moly" education (grades 3-5) is still under consideration as well as a Senior High fellowship opportunity.

The Church Council voted to approve hiring a full time Youth Minister. This position will be posted soon.



Fall is here and we are back to regular routines. The choir practices every Sunday at 8:40 AM, and generally sings in church on the first and third Sundays of the month. Everyone who likes to sing is welcome to join. We have a very welcoming choir and it's fun to make melodies together.

# Mission the Month C. C. Food Shelf

The Cook County Food Shelf is **not** a government funded program. We receive food and funds due to the generosity of community members and groups who care about the well being of our residents. There are no income guidelines, you have only to ask for our assistance.

Our mission statement is simply "The Cook County Food Shelf exists to provide an emergency 3-day supply of food once a month for families who would otherwise go hungry because of financial hardship".

Our open hours are every Monday 3:00pm until 5:00 pm and the first Wednesday of the month from 4:30 pm until 6:30 pm. We could always use more volunteers to pack bags and boxes of food during our open hours, or to assist clients. We try to be fair with every person who uses the food shelf regardless of their status or job description.

# Food Suggestions:

- ⇒ stews. chilis, hearty soups. chow mien or chop suey
- ⇒ soup in cans, dry packets, or shelf stable cartons
- ⇒ cream soups like mushroom, chicken and celery to use as a gravy: gravy mixes.
- ⇒ rice, rice mixes, pastas, pasta mixes, mac & cheese

- ⇒ peanut butter, jams or jellies
- ⇒ cereals (non-sweet is good for most appetites)
- ⇒ canned fruits or canned vegetables: canned tomatoes, tomato sauces, canned potatoes, sweet potatoes, canned beans of any type.
- ⇒ juice in cans, bottles, or dry canisters
- ⇒ crackers and cookies (yes. desserts|)
- ⇒ tuna, spam, canned chicken or other meats

Anything you and your family likes to eat, most of the users of our food shelf would also like. Our clients are creative, out of necessity. Personal items like toothbrushes, combs, shampoos, etc. would also be appreciated. Please no dry beans or peas (we have many of them already).

Facilitators are Melissa Beseres. MSW, LICSW and Anna Ross. To see if this group might


