During the season of Epiphany we did a 4-week sermon series on God's Call for our lives. Each Sunday we dove into the scriptures to read what God's Call looked like in the lives of folks centuries ago, and imagined what it might look for us today. It was my hope that through this sermon series <u>you</u> might here from God about the Call God has for you - that the Holy Spirit would lead you into bringing God's Kingdom to earth to people and places that desperately need it.

If you didn't hear from God this Epiphany, don't worry! Sometimes these things take a long time to figure out. For example, I first felt a generic "call to ministry" in middle school, but it took *years* for me to discover that I was called to be a Pastor (not a youth director) in the Lutheran (not the Baptist) church. You, too, may be on a long and winding path to where God is leading you. Enjoy the ride, and keep your eyes peeled for what God is up to in your life!

If you already have a Call from God that you are invested in good! As many of us know, our Call can change, grow, or look different over time. I hope that this sermon series affirmed the Call that you already have, and gave you some groundwork for the future in case your Call changes.

If you heard from God during the time we did this sermon series, I want you to share it with the people in this congregation. Stories of people hearing from God are encouraging, inspiring, and hopeful. Not only that, but you sharing what you heard and how you heard it will help others to find their Call, too!

Wherever you find yourself (maybe in a place not listed in this newsletter article), "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in God, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." (Romans 15:13)



Faith matures by reaching out, stretching minds, enlarging hearts, sharing struggles, living prayer, binding up the broken parts; till we find the commonplace ripe with witness to God's Grace. (Faith Begins By Letting Go, Verse 3, ACS 1004)

I love the words of this hymn from our new *All Creation Sings* hymnal. Each of the verses sings about our Call from God to bring God's kingdom into the world's kingdom. The words above are from the final verse of the hymn, which focuses on our outward call to the world.

Here the hymn reminds us that our faith is strengthened by reaching out to others. But that it's not just outreach, it's stretching our minds and enlarging our hearts (what could be called "empathy") - by sharing struggles, living prayer, and binding up the broken parts. Each of these calls to maturing our faith is tied to issues of social justice - helping those who need it, especially the least of these. Learning people's stories, and sharing their struggles rather than throwing money or things at the problems to try to fix them.

We do this not to support any one political party, not to pat ourselves on the back, and certainly not because we think we can fix this world. We are called to this work because this is the work of God's Grace - because the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus not only mirrored this behavior, but called each of us to it as well. May we work together until we can "find the commonplace ripe with witness to God's Grace."


First Communion Classes


Valentine's Cookie Cookie

Recap

On January 28, 2024, Bethlehem Lutheran Church held its Annual Congregational

meeting. This was a standard business meeting including approval of 2022 Annual Meeting minutes, voting on new council members, and discussions and voting on the 2024 budget.

During Pastor Calvin's address he recognized all of the members who work together to lead the congregation in worship, meals, Coffee An', children & youth volunteers, and so many more! Looking to the future, everything looks very hopeful. We have a strong budget, thanks to your faithful and generous giving. We have had lots of visitors and have received new members. We have meaningful worship services with strong music teams and a great live stream presence. We have bible studies - men's, women's circle and the weekly text study. Pastor Calvin does a monthly service with the Care Center residents and is making home visits. Since he joined Bethlehem, he has led us in new and special services: Pet Blessings, Healing Service, Honoring Veterans, and Confirmation. There are many opportunities that members can participate in, including serving, study and worship.

Changes to Council: Mike Chmelik and Eric Anderson concluded their roles as president and vice president and will remain on the council through then end of their terms. Sue Hennessy and Shawn Swearingen were voted in as new council members. Hilja Iverson has stepped off council due to personal reasons. Hilja will join the Nominating Committee for next year. Mission Endowment Committee: Dianne Peterson's term has expired and Annie DeBevec volunteered to fill the vacant position. At the February council meeting the members will vote on Executive Committee positions.

2024 Budget: Discussions included the increased (doubling) cost of church insurance, which is a problem with churches all over the nation. It's hard to understand that only doubling the insurance cost is a good thing, and Chmelik stated that if we don't have any claims, we should be able to reduce our costs in the next 5 years or so. This budget includes the hiring of a Director of Children, Youth and Family Ministry, and the employment search will begin immediately.

Thank you, Ist & 2nd Volunteers!

Bethlehem received a check for \$5,723 from 1st & 2nd Thrift Store at their Annual Payout Party. Total payout for 2023 was \$117,389.25. The store celebrated reaching the Million-dollar mark of contributing back to this community since starting in July 2007. At the time of this writing a list of the amazing volunteers that donated their hours to Bethlehem isn't available, so **THANK YOU ALL!** Each volunteer hour was worth \$27.30! As a reminder "They are always in need of new volunteers!"...and what a great way to add monies to church programs, meet new people, and have some fun!


