Happy New Year, People of Bethlehem!

I'm excited to see where God continues to call us as a church in 2026. The Holy Spirit has continued to call people to our church, whether it's new families, individuals, confirmation students, or visitors - God is working in people's lives.

For new folks, regulars, or long timers, we're offering an adult ed class called Lutheranism 101. It's an opportunity to learn or be refreshed about the basics of Lutheranism, and an opportunity to learn about Bethlehem. “So if anyone is in Christ,

there is a new creation:

everything old has passed away;

look, new things have come into being!”

2 Corinthians 5:17

A new year often means New Year's Resolutions. These are things that we've been wanting to change, try, take on, or get rid of - and a new year is the perfect time to try. New Year's Resolutions are so commonly quit, that there is a day dedicated to quitting them called “Quitter's Day.” Quitters Day is the second Friday after the new year has come - just two weeks after starting something. Resolutions are good things to do, regardless if we quit them or not - but I think that they're often quit because we depend on our own power to make them happen.

There is a promise from God in 2 Corinthians, that you are a new creation in Christ. This is something that we don't need to worry about because it doesn't depend on our own power. It is the power of Christ that makes this happen. Jesus makes us new in the waters of baptism, and the Holy Spirit equips us with what we need for the days ahead.

Our Mission of the Month for January is the **Violence Prevention Center** of Cook County, MN.

Located in the heart of Grand Marais, the Violence Prevention Center works with survivors of domestic and sexual assault. In 2025, the Violence Prevention Center provided services to more than 280 clients in Cook County. Services include safety planning to flee abusive situations, safety lodging for people in immediate danger, legal advocacy and help in obtaining restraining orders or orders for protection, grocery and gas assistance and much more.

By choosing the Violence Prevention Center as our Mission of the Month we are providing direct help to our own Cook County neighbors. In 2026 the Violence Prevention Center celebrates 40 years of service to our community. Let's help them reach their fundraising goals so they can continue their work for the next 40 years!



Update on Reconciling in Christ

It has been a busy year for the Reconciling in Christ Committee. The Committee met often the beginning of the year and is now wrapping up. We sent letters in January 2025 to members of the congregation with our Statement of Intent. Mike Chmelik and Karina Roth reached out to members to offer one-on-one meetings

with the goal of listening to feelings and thoughts and concerns regarding the Statement of Intent.

Emmy Kegler visited in February, spoke on what it means to be Welcoming and led a workshop on How to Read the Bible.

In July, Pastor Diane Jacobsen spoke on inclusiveness and led a workshop on the story of Lydia in the Bible.

In addition, Pastor Calvin wrote numerous newsletters addressing each step in the Statement of Intent, clarifying the RIC Committee's intentions.

In October, the RIC Committee drafted a Welcome Statement, which will go on the website. The purpose of this Welcome Statement is that visitors or new folks to the community can see, before stepping into the building, that they will be welcomed into all aspects of our church, including communion, fellowship and leadership roles. The Welcome Statement was presented to the Church Council in October, and has since been mailed out to all church members, with the opportunity to offer feedback if desired.

In January 2026, at the Annual Meeting, we will vote on the Welcome Statement, which will determine if we become a Reconciling in Christ church.

about themselves and more about God’s unending love for them!

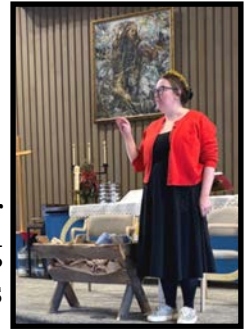

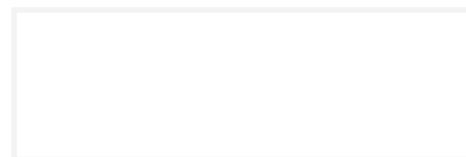
