September Devotion



Martin Luther's Prayer for Help in a Time of Need

Dear God, in the midst of anguish and need,
I am in great trouble. My neighbors have their trials
which the devil increases. This is not the time to ask
whether I am godly or worthy. Help me now in this time
of need, as you said you would. Amen.

One thing I often hear in times of pastoral counsel is that people don't think they can approach God in prayer. They feel nervous that God will be mad that they haven't prayed in a while, or that they only pray when they need something, or that they're sure there are other prayer requests that are more important than their own.


Jesus tells us in Matthew 7 to ask, seek, and knock. Jesus encourages us to talk to God regardless of piety. And when the disciples ask how they should pray, Jesus doesn't give them a list of behaviors that they need to follow before they can pray - he simply teaches them to pray using what we know as "The Lord's Prayer."

In Luther's prayer written above, he has a sense of urgency for his prayers. He recognizes the anxiety that many have about being godly or worthy enough to be heard, but presses on, holding tight to what Jesus said in the scriptures: to ask, seek, and knock.

Today, know that you can be confident going to God in prayer. And you can be confident that God will hear your prayers, and will be at work on your behalf.

A Note about the Offering Plate

from Pastor Calvin

This September we are going to try passing the offering plate again, after the passing of the peace and before communion, where it is traditionally placed in a service. The Worship Committee decided this after some conversation. We are going to try doing this only for the month of September, and then we'll go back to not passing it for the next 3 weeks to see how it feels.

Why are we going to try this?

Here are some things we've heard that brought us to this decision:

- 1. Some parents have shared that they use the offering plate as an opportunity to teach their kids about stewardship.
- 2. We have heard some people in the congregation share that they find the passing of the plate to be a worshipful time.
- 3. Pragmatically, it adds a much-needed contemplative, sit down time during worship.
- 4. We've heard some anecdotes about visitors not knowing about the offering and missing it, and we want the spiritual practice of financial giving to be easy and accessible to all folks, including visitors.

During September and the 3-weeks that follow, I want to encourage you to spend some time in thought and prayer about the passing of the plate. If you have thoughts, comments, or questions about passing the plate, please direct them to me or the members of our worship committee.



Medical Traveler Cards

Recently we received a generous donation, through memorials honoring Elaine Rabold, to our medical traveler cards. When talking about this donation at our Men's Bible Study, it was brought up that some folks may not know, or may have forgotten about the traveler cards.

We were pleased to offer Camp Scholarships and had a number of families request funds to help send their children to camp this summer. Vacation Bible School was offered August 8-10, 2023. Our theme was *God's Good Creation*. The class was open to students who are going into First

through 5th grades. We had 9 grade school students attend, and 7 middle school/confirmation helpers. Roger Barton trained Lute and Birk Jansen to put the opening action songs on the Big Screen. They did an awesome job. Pastor Calvin led the Bible stories and Games. Kris Hedstrom directed the crafts. Laurie Spry helped with registration. Carrie Jansen provided the snacks.

Pastor Calvin hosted a Meet and Greet for middle and high school students with parents on August 30,2023 for a time of getting to know each other (Pastor Calvin and the students), games and snacks. It was an opportunity to learn about what's happening this year without having to feel compelled to make commitments.

The Confirmation Calendar is set for 2023-2024 and has one big change: Confirmation is back to Wednesday nights! A leaders meeting will be set in early September (to be announced). Mission the Month Center for Changing Lives

In August, our Mission of the Month supported local Cook County students in need of school supplies to begin the school year. Thank you to those of you who dropped off school supplies and gave financial contributions! As we transition into September, we continue to think of the needs of young people and how we, as a church community, can offer our love and support. Our September Mission of the Month is the Center for Changing Lives in Duluth.

The Center for Changing Lives an affiliate program of Lutheran Social Services (LSS). Having opened its doors in 2017, the Center for Changing Lives provides youth with resources to lead productive, healthy and independent lives. Each year, LSS and the Center for Changing Lives provide services to 800+ youth experiencing homelessness in the Duluth area. LSS notes that "Most are not homeless by choice. Circumstances put them at risk of dropping out of school, unemployment, chemical dependency, trafficking and an adult life of homelessness."

The Center for Changing Lives is a safe, central site where young people who are at-risk of experiencing homelessness can find holistic guidance and support. The Center is 27,000 square feet and contains offices, meeting spaces and housing for youth. The building is ideally located near a bus line, pharmacy, grocery store and employment opportunities. A range of wellness services, life-skills training, educational support, youth groups, and job skill development/mentoring are offered.

Offering Counters: Could you commit to one Sunday a month (or every other month)? Since you will already be in church, enjoy Coffee An' following the service, and then come down to the 'Business Office'. It usually doesn't take very long but we do want two people involved. There are instructions in a notebook on what to do and how to do them.

Reader of the Scripture Lessons and the Psalm (read responsively). A print-out in large print is available for pickup or can be emailed to you in advance Sunday.

Hosting Coffee An': Usually a council member makes the coffee first thing Sunday mornings. You are asked to bring something handmade or store bought or left overs from something else. Anything is 'fair-game'. Bring before worship begins, set it on trays/ plates, be sure napkins and a basket are available on the counter, forks if necessary.
